



Petr Tégl Of Counsel

Petr Tégl has been working at our law firm since 2014 in the position of legal expert.

He received a master's degree in law from the Faculty of Law at Charles University in Prague, where he also received the title of JUDr. and then a Ph.D. degree in private law. In addition, he studied in the Faculty of Law at Uniwersytetu Wrocław, Poland, where he also occasionally lectures, and in the Faculty of Law at Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität München, Germany. In 2006, he received the title of senior lecturer (associate professor) in civil law from the Faculty of Law at Palacký University in Olomouc.

From 2005 to 2010, he was an assistant professor in the Department of Civil Law in the Faculty of Law at Charles University. From 2010, he was first an assistant professor and now he is a senior lecturer in the Department of Private Law and Civil Proceedings in the Faculty of Law at Palacký University in Olomouc. He is also a member of the Scientific Council at the faculty. From 2007 to 2012, Petr was a member of the re-codification committee at the Ministry of Justice for the preparation of the new Civil Code and after that a member of the committee for drafting new legislation and the new act on non-contentious civil court procedures. He was also a member of the Committee for Application of the New Civil Legislation at the Ministry of Justice.

Since 2011, he has been a member of the committee for private law at the Government Legislative Council. He is also a member of the work group at the Ministry of Transport for selected legal issues and a member of the private law section of the Czech Bar Association. Furthermore, he lectures at the Judicial Academy of the Czech Republic. In addition, Petr is a researcher in the Institute of Law and Jurisprudence at the Czech Academy of Sciences. Since 2015, he has been a member of the commission for the re-codification of private law in Slovakia.

In addition to articles relating to substantive and procedural civil law published at home and abroad, Petr is also a co-author of a university textbook on substantive civil law (Wolters Kluwer, 2009) and a co-author of the Large Academic Commentary to the Civil Code (Linde, 2008). He is currently preparing a large commentary to the new Civil Code as the chief editor (together with Filip Melzer) and co-author (to be published by Leges).
